

1993 Frigid Digger Race

Saturday, 20 February – Race Director Bill Yeagle and the Montana Tech Athletic Department reactivated its Frigid Digger Races after a four-year hiatus with the 3-mile and 7-mile courses following the traditional routes. The races' \$10 entry fee came with a complimentary t-shirt. The races started at 11:30 a.m. and the course was covered with more than 20 cm of snow and some slippery ice pack. 19 runners finished the races.

Butte's John Willard, who finished second in the 3-mile, reported wearing track spikes for needed traction on the slippery surface.

Doug Compton, also of Butte, won the 7-mile and he said "... the running conditions were quite difficult due to cold temps and a recent snow ... we were running on a snowmobile-packed trail."
