28th Annual American Legion Veterans' Day Race

Thursday, 11 Nov 1965 at Legion Hall in Uptown Butte – Butte High's "Clean Sweep" of Scoring.

Bob Davis' threat to join Lester Sodja as a three time winner of the Veterans' Day Race vanished when he moved with his family to Minnesota before the school year. The absence of Davis left a wide-open field. The race was dominated by Butte High teammates Terry Eamon and Gary Keltz. The two ran neck-and-neck until cresting the Idaho Street hill and turning into the finish stretch on Broadway. At that point Keltz broke stride and Eamon pulled away to win in a time of 15:15. Keltz, who may still have been nursing a pulled muscle from about a month earlier, walked twice in

the last stretch allowing teammates George and Dobbs to pass before regaining his composer to break into a finishing run.

Like their great 1948 team, Butte High again claimed all six scoring spots (and seventh place as well) in the race, collecting all 21 possible team points on the 6-5-4-3-2-1 scoring format. The Bulldogs were awarded permanent possession of the C. Owen Smithers trophy which saw its seventh and final year of competition. The Purples would have won the team trophy without scoring a single point this year, due to their domination of the event in recent years.

The outstanding performance by the Bulldogs capped the brilliant and long-lasting career of Butte High coach, Harry "Swede" Dahlberg, who plans to retire from coaching after next spring's Interscholastic track and field championship. Dahlberg has helped put on this race since its inaugural year in 1934, when he was already in his thirteenth year of coaching at Butte High.

The race was started at 11 a.m. after Ed Gerry's 11 aerial bombs, and then Police Chief Jim Clark and other officers provided squad car pacing units throughout the race, with additional motorcycle police providing support at key intersections. Hugo Kenck and Dalhberg were the timers, and a crew of Legionnaires served as judges.
